A daughter's father betroth her to a guy with dowry in hope that he and his family will love, respect and take all care of her after marriage, but everything seems fake. She is mentally, physically and even financially harassed by her typical, down market husband and in-laws. Some families in Haryana, Punjab and many other states it is openly done which is visible, but in many places, they are internally tortured, so it gets lime lighted very rarely. In this case, what could a helpless, innocent girl can do, if she goes and makes voice against them, their rigid stone-hearted husband and his family treats like an animal and force her to commit suicide.

For this reason many daughters don't want to marry when they observe the worse cases of women after their married life that don't get freedom and rights to come out of the cage of their in-laws house.

Brutality of our society doesn't end here only. Women who are not interested in marriage as they don't want to compromise with their liberty of joy after wedding, nobody is there to support her wish, as the family feel a women life is vague without husband and children. Can anyone tell me if some are not ready for marriage then why are they forced to do so, they are educated, self-dependent and can survive on their own, so why she can't live according to her own choice!

On the one side, our men worship Goddess **Durga, Lakshmi, Kali, and Saraswati** on other side; we harass women for dowry, rape and kill her. One side we praise successful women of our country, such as **Shobha De, Shreya Ghoshal, Deepika Padukone,** on the other side punishable crime of female foeticide is done fearlessly. Daughters are killed without any fault in her mother womb before she opens her eyes to see this wicked world, who knows they are future pride of our country like **Saina Nehwal, Marry Komand Kalpna Chawla.** Many girls commit suicide because her father can't afford to marry her with a huge amount of dowry. Many women helplessly burn themselves alive, since they failed to fulfill the ridiculous wish of their in-laws by not giving birth to a boy child.

This should be stopped by educating girls and making women aware of their rights. They need not to suffer due to patriarchy in the society. They have to raise their voice and fight against injustice. The mindset of the society should be changed that women are equally doing better in all the fields of their life.





એની પાછળ રસપ્રદ ઘટના છે, પણ એ પહેલાં આ કૉલેજની સ્થાપના પાછળ કઈ જીદ કામ કરી ગઈ એ વાત પણ એટલી જ રસપ્રદ છે.

વાત એમ બની કે હાલ ભાવનગર યુનિવર્સિટીના વાણિજ્ય ભવનના ડીન તરીકે કાર્યરત પ્રોકેસર **સુરેશ** સવાણીએ વર્ષ ૨૦૦૩માં ભાવનગરની પ્રતિષ્ઠિત ગણાતી એમ.જે. કોમર્સ કોલેજમાં પ્રિન્સિપાલની જગ્યા માટે અરજી કરી. રાજકીય દબાણને કારણે એમની જગ્યાએ અન્ય કોઈની પસંદગી થઈ એટલે એમનો અહમ્ ઘવાયો. ચિત્રલેખા સાથેની

વાતચીતમાં એ ખુદ કબૂલે છે: 'હા, એ મારો સાત્વિક અહમ્ હતો અને એને કારણે જ મેં નક્કી કર્યું કે હું પ્રિન્સિપાલ ન બની શક્યો તો કંઈ નહીં, પણ હું પ્રિન્સિપાલ બનાવી શકું એવું જરૂર કરીશ!'

સ્વામિનારાયણ સંપ્રદાયના યુસ્ત સત્સંગી એવા સુરેશભાઈનો પરિવાર આમ તો સાધારણ પરિવાર. આર્થિક લોન લઈને એમણે વર્ષ ૨૦૦૪માં સહજ જ્ઞાન એજ્યુકેશનલ ઍન્ડ ચેરિટેબલ ટ્રસ્ટના નેજા હેઠળ આ કૉલેજ શરૂ કરી. એ સ્થાપક ટ્રસ્ટી અને એમનાં પત્ની સરયુબહેન સવાણી મૅનેજિંગ ટ્રસ્ટી. મનમાં બે જ સંકલ્પ: કૉલેજને શ્રેષ્ઠ બનાવવી અને



ફેતલ પહેતાઃ અમારા સ્ટાફમાં આંતરિક રાજકારણ લગભગ શૂન્ય છે.

કોઈની પાસેથી રૂપિયાનુંય દાન ન લેવું. આજે ૧૩ વર્ષમાં એમણે સંસ્થામાં દસેક કરોડ રૂપિયા ખર્ચ્યા છે એમાં દોઢેક કરોડ રૂપિયાનું તો ફક્ત વ્યાજ ચૂક્વ્યું છે, પણ ૧૩૫ વિદ્યાર્થી, એક શિક્ષક, એક કલર્ક અને એક પટ્ટાવાળા સાથે શરૂ થયેલી આ કોલેજ આજે અહીં સુધી પહોંચી છે.

જો કે કોલેજ શરૂ થઈ ત્યારે કંઈ ફક્ત લેડી ટીચર જ રાખવી એવો વિચાર નહોતો. શરૂઆતમાં સ્ટાફમાં અડધી સંખ્યામાં પુરુષ અધ્યાપકો પણ હતા, પરંતુ વર્ષ ૨૦૧૧માં અમદાવાદમાં નિરમા યુનિવર્સિટીમાં યોજાયેલી એક કૉન્ફરન્સ દરમિયાન સુરેશભાઈને તત્કાલીન મુખ્ય મંત્રી નરેન્દ્ર મોદીને મળવાની તક મળી. વાતચીતમાં નરેન્દ્રભાઈએ કહ્યું: સુરેશભાઈ, મહિલા યુનિવર્સિટી બનાવવાનું વિચારો!

યુનિવર્સિટી તો બહુ દૂરનું સપનું હતું, પણ સુરેશભાઈએ નક્કી કર્યું કે કૉલેજ મહિલા અધ્યાપકોની જ બનાવવી. પુરુષ કર્મચારીઓને નોકરીમાંથી કાઢી તો ન જ મુકાય એટલે એ બધાને પોતાની વગથી ક્યાંક ને ક્યાંક નોકરીમાં ગોઠવી દીધા અને નવી ભરતીમાં મહિલા શિક્ષકોની જ પસંદગી કરી. એ કહે છેઃ 'મને આનંદ છે કે અમારો આ નિર્ણય ખોટો નથી પડ્યો. મને અમારી શિક્ષિકાઓની ક્ષમતા પર પૂરો ભરોસો છે.'

આ ભરોસો જળવાઈ રહે એવા પ્રસંગ પણ બન્યા છે. વર્ષ ૨૦૧૩માં યુનિવર્સિટીની પરીક્ષાનું કેન્દ્ર અહીં હતું. ક્લાસિકલ સંસ્કૃતની પરીક્ષામાં એક કમાન્ડો વિદ્યાર્થીની જગ્યાએ ડમી કમાન્ડો હાથમાં મોટા છરા સાથે પરીક્ષા આપવા બેસી ગયો. કદાચ મનમાં વિચાર્ય હશે કે આ છોકરીઓ શં કરી લેવાની? ક્લાસ રૂમમાં જ ગાર્ગી વ્યાસ અને ભક્તિ રાવલ નામની બે સપરવાઈઝર બહેને એને ચોરી કરતાં પકડ્યો. હો-હા થઈ એટલે પ્રિન્સિપાલ હેતલબહેન અને અન્ય સ્ટાક ભેગો થઈ ગયો. એટલામાં ઓરિજિનલ વિદ્યાર્થી હતો એય ક્યાંકથી આવી ચડ્યો. બન્નેએ મળીને દાદાગીરી શરૂ કરી, પણ ત્યાં સુધીમાં તો શિક્ષિકાઓ રણચંડી બની ચુકી હતી. આ પરાક્રમ બદલ પાછળથી યુનિવર્સિટીએ પ્રિન્સિપાલ હેતલબહેનને ખાસ બિરદાવ્યાં હતાં. આ જ હેતલબહેન ભૂતકાળમાં માથાભારે વિદ્યાર્થીઓને કેમ્પસમાંથી કાઢી ચૂક્યાં છે.

ટ્રસ્ટ તરફથી ગરીબ છોકરીઓને ભણવા માટે વિદ્યાલશ્રમી સ્કૉલરશિય મળે છે. ભૂતકાળમાં થેલેસેમિયાગ્રસ્ત યુવતી ચાંદની શાહને લેખક આઈ.કે. વીજળીવાળાની ભલામણથી મેરિટની ઉપરવટ જઈનેય પ્રવેશ આપેલો. કારણ? આ યુવતીની એક જ ઈચ્છા હતી કે કૉલેજનું શિક્ષણ મેળવવું!

તો પછી આ નારીશક્તિના ફેલાવા સમી
 વમન યુનિવર્સિટીનું શું થયું?

સુરેશભાઈ ચિત્રલેખાને કહે છે કે સપનું છે, પણ અત્યારે આર્થિક બોજો ઉપાડી શકાય એમ નથી. દાન લેવું નથી. લઈએ તો ટ્રસ્ટીઓને પૂછીને પાણી પીવું પડે. એ કરવું નથી. અત્યારે પણ અમે પ્રિન્સિપાલ અને સ્ટાફને નિર્ણયો લેવાની સંપૂર્ણ છૂટ આપી છે.

હા, કૉલેજમાં હાલ માસ્ટર ઑફ સોશિયલ વર્કના કોર્સમાં અંતરિયાળ વિસ્તારમાં ફીલ્ડવર્ક માટે જવું પડે એટલે સુરક્ષાને કારણસર ત્રણ યુવાન આ માટે રાખ્યા છે, પણ હેતલબહેન કહે છે કે હવે અમારી બહેનો જ આ કામ કરવા તૈયાર છે. આવતા શૈક્ષણિક સત્રથી અમારાં ફિઝિકલ ઈન્સ્ટ્રક્ટર કલ્પના ત્રિવેદી અને અન્ય બહેનો જ આ કામ સંભાળી લેશે.

# Indian Government Schemes For Women Empowerment

### Mahila E-haat

It is a direct online marketing platform launched by the Ministry of Women and Child Development to support women entrepreneurs, Self Helf Groups (SHGs) and Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) to showcase products made and services rendered by them. This is a part of the 'Digital India' initiative. Women can register themselves at www.mahilaehaat-rmk.gov.in and leverage technology for showcasing their work to a broader market.



### Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao

This is a social campaign aimed at eradication of female foeticide and raising awareness on welfare services intended for young Indian girls. The "Save the Girl Child" movement was launched on 22 January 2015, it is a joint initiative run by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and the Ministry of Human Resource Development.Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao - The scheme was launched with an initial funding of Rs 100 crores. It mainly targets the clusters in Uttarakhand, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Delhi and Haryana. In India, the child gender ratio in the age group of 0 - 6 years stood at 931 girls for 1000 boys and it dropped to 918 girls for every 1000 boys in 2011. Sex - selective abortion or female foeticide in India has led to the sharp

decline in the ratio of girls born in contrast to the boys in some states in the country. The wide gap in child gender ratio was first noted in 1991 when the national census data was released and it turned out to be a worsening problem after the release of 2001 national census data. To bridge the growing gap between the birth of girl and boy infants, the government of India has taken up an initiative to promote Beti Bachao Beti Padhao and many programmes has been organized to promote 'Save Girl Child' and to 'Educate Girl Child', since January 2015.

The campaign has also received support from the Indian Medical Association.



### **One Stop Centre Scheme**

Popularly known as 'Sakhi,' it was implemented on 1st April 2015 with the 'Nirbhaya' fund. The One Stop Centres are established at various locations in India for providing shelter, police desk, legal, medical and counselling services to victims of violence under one roof integrated with a 24-hour Helpline. The toll-free helpline number is 181. Here is a list of Sakhi centres across the country. These centres can be contacted for: Emergency Response and Rescue Services Medical Assistance. Assistance in lodging FIR /NCR/DIR Psycho - social support/counselling Legal aid and counselling Shelter Video Conferencing Facility to record statement for police/courts



### **Swadhar Greh**

The Swadhar scheme was launched by the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development in 2002 for rehabilitation of women in difficult circumstances. The scheme provides shelter, food, clothing and care to the marginalized women/girls who are in need. The beneficiaries include widows deserted by their families and relatives, women prisoners released from jail and without family support, women survivors of natural disasters, women victims of terrorist/extremist violence etc. The implementing agencies are mainly NGOs.




# 10 Books by Indian Women Authors Everyone Must Read




### 2. Anita Desai: The Zigzag Way






### 4. Amrita Pritam: Pinjar


### 5. Kiran Desai: Inheritance of Loss


### 6. Tanuja Desai Hidier: Born Confused








#### 8. Chitra Divakurni: The Palace of Illusions


### 9. Balli Kaur Jaswal : Erotic Stories for Punjabi Widows



# The Changing Role of Women in Literature

### **Medieval Literature**

The women of the Medieval times were surprisingly a lot more candid and sexual than one might expect of an era where the ideal of femininity was Mary, the mother of Jesus. In actuality, the women in the literature of the period, as well as the historical female figures seemed to be torn between the ideal and the physical desires and domineering character that her antagonist, Eve, embodies. In a careful reading of the literature of the time, one finds the first buds of a feminist literature emerging from the words on the pages.

### **Greek Mythology**

Women in Greek mythology were perceived to be more as sexual objects than individuals. Many were taken advantage of by the Gods and by human beings. One would see that women's rights were very limited and they were not allowed to express much of their freedoms. Within this time period women were blamed for wars, destruction of towns, and the death of men. It was not unliky to see goddesses using their powers for vengeance. Although the role of human women was limited the existence of goddesses attributed great amounts of power to female characters.

### **Elizabethan Literature**

The theme of misogyny and superiority of men was the typical genre that authors took within their writing.



Women were not looked to as a person but were considered a mere necessity for the procreation process. Women continued to be split between the ideal of the Virgin Mary, and her fallible counterpart, Eve. Unfortunately, the Virgin Mary was one of a kind, so there was often a general distrust of women. This distrust of women lead to most works degrading the female race, and terming females as the "other", which was to be feared. Equality between the sexes was not present within this era, and is evident from the numerous writings degrading the female race.

### **Victorian and Turn of the Century Literature**

The role of women in 19th century literature was one in which they redefine their place in society by accepting an image of themselves which involved both home-centeredness and inferiority. Elizabeth Gaskell did not concede to the idea of women's inferiority, although she does concede to the notion that a woman's place is in the home, as is evident by her portrayal of Bessie in her poem "Cranford." In this time period, women were being portrayed as protagonists more often than in the past. In Gustave Flaubert's novel Madame Bovary, Emma, the lead character, is portrayed as a "tragic heroine." At the time the book was written (1856), the character of Emma was viewed as foolish and putting herself in narrow circumstances. Her suicide demonstrates the dangers of life for women who were looking to become independent at that time. Alfred Lord Tennyson's poem,

"Man for the field and woman for the hearth, Man for the sword and for the needle she: Man with the head and woman with the heart: Man to command and woman to obey"

It is evident from these works that during this time women were still in a subjugated role despite their desire to break free of societies' restrictions.

### **20th Century Literature**

Women's roles in literature has evolved throughout history and had lead women to develop into strong independent roles. Modern literature has served as an outlet and sounding board for women's rights and feminist pioneers. Female writers have come to the fore front and provided today's readers with a vast array of ethnic and cultural perspectives. The unique voice of female minorities is a common theme in many coming of age novels that allows each writer to establish a separate identity for their characters and themselves. Women in modern literature often include strong independent females juxtaposed by oppressed women to provide examples for young female readers and to critique short comings of our society. The emergence of the independent female novelist in America has allowed for a new evolution of the role of women in fictional literature.
